"A Sheepdogs Tale"

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." Acts 2:1-5 NRSV

I remember a book that could often be found beside my father's chair in the living room years ago. The title of the little book was, "Power for Living". It was a collection of vignettes written by or about famous people that had experienced God's grace and strength in their lives. I remember my father occasionally reading some of these accounts to me as we sat together. The stories of other people that had been helped by God encouraged him to look for ways that God would help him on his life journey.

These first few verses of Acts chapter 2 give us a glimpse into the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the early church. Jesus had promised that he would not leave these disciples and first followers without power to live the lives he had called them to, He instructed them to stay in Jerusalem until they were clothed with "**power from on high**"!

I have read and reread this exciting account of the birthday of the church – it fascinates and encourages me in much the same way that the stories of others encouraged my father. This year as I prepare to lead our congregation in Pentecost celebrations, I keep being drawn to this small phrase in Acts 2:1. "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place."

All together in one place. Imagine! I don't believe that Doctor Luke was primarily referring to a geographic location – I think the unity he is witnessing was a deep spiritual unity that bound these seekers together in their discipleship. As we prepare to celebrate Pentecost this year I pray that God will breath into us God's Holy Spirit and cause us to all be together on this journey. Wear red on June 5th for Pentecost if you have it – above all bring a heart of peace and unity as we call to our God asking for power for living this call.

Come and join us for worship this Sunday morning at 9:00 A.M. for our Heritage worship service featuring our choir and familiar hymns. Stop in for Praise and Contemporary worship lead by Nairobi Smith at 6:00 P.M. on Friday nights. We have pizza and fellowship and a great time together! It has been exciting to have our church family returning and worshipping together, but both of these services will be available online through Facebook and YouTube. We'll save you a seat!






