- a chance to learn about new groups & activities



#### A New Class

On Wednesday mornings, 10:00 to 11:30 a.m., September 25 to October 30, there will be a new class using Joyce Rupps book "The Cup of Our Life". The class will join together to review the daily study that they have used as a devotional during the week. The daily study can take 15 minutes or more. As with anything the more one put into it the more they will get out of it. Each lesson includes a short story and suggests some reflective journaling along with prayer.

The class will include looking back over the week and sharing what was found most meaningful. It will include reflection, scripture, meditation, visualizations and a refocusing on prayer using a cup of one's own choosing. The cup will provide images such as the open cup, the chipped cup, the broken cup, and the blessing cup for reflection.
