"A Sheepdogs Tale"

"The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the Israelites and say to them: These are the appointed festivals of the Lord that you shall proclaim as holy convocations, my appointed festivals. "Six days shall work be done, but the seventh day is a Sabbath of complete rest, a holy convocation; you shall do no work: it is a Sabbath to the Lord throughout your settlements "These are the appointed festivals of the Lord, the holy convocations, that you shall celebrate at the time appointed for them." Leviticus 23:1-4 NRSV

In the 23rd chapter of the Book of Leviticus Moses outlines the years celebrations and Holy Days (holidays) for the people of Israel. From these first notes on Sabbath keeping, thru the balance of the year, Festivals are ordered and held to help the people remember the great goodness of God.

We are following in this important Judeo-Christian tradition of ordering or declaring a Festival – our Fall Fete!


Fellowship Schedule 2022-23
